Note: There is no equivalent in the upper limb of **quadratus plantae** (flexor accessorius) which is supplied by the lateral plantar nerve. Easy to remember as this muscle arises on the lateral side of the foot.

This table clearly shows that the lateral plantar nerve is the equivalent to the ulnar nerve and the medial plantar is equivalent to the median nerve.
